Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe

The kingship of Christ is not a doctrine which impairs in any way the rights of secular sovereigns.

The claim made is to a sovereignty in spiritual things. Let us look at the Gospel to see in what sense our Lord makes that claim himself, and infer from that the mind of his Church on the subject. Our Lord's words, remember, were spoken at a solemn moment, and when he was under oath (so to speak) before a judicial interrogation. The charge referred against him, the only charge of which a Roman judge is likely to take cognizance, is that he represents himself as being a king. In all probability, he can save his life by denying it. Does he deny it? He does not. "Thou sayest that I am a king" –that, of course, is a Hebrew way of answering in the affirmative; the idiom is exactly the same which you get in modern American slang – "You said it". Then he goes on to explain the sense in which the charge is true. He is a king, but his kingdom is not "of this world". Does he mean "My kingdom does not belong to this world; it will only be realized in a future life"? No, you can't get that from the Greek. The sense of the Greek words is, "My kingdom does not arise out of this world. The means, that is to say, by which it is to be established are not the means which you associate with revolutionary movements; if they were, I should not be standing here, my friends would have rescued me. My kingdom does not arise out of this world, and yet even in this world, even where I stand before you a helpless prisoner, I do claim, here and now, to be a king."

A king, then, in what sense and by what right? Because, he says, "I have come into the world for one express purpose, to bear witness to the truth. And truth, once it is rightly apprehended, has a compelling power over men's hearts; they must needs assert and defend what they know to be the truth, or they would lose their birthright as men. Everyone who is of the truth hears my voice; everyone who makes truth his starting-point, has a true background to his life, and a true spring of motive for his actions, necessarily becomes a subject of my kingdom. You have no reason to fear, so far as I am concerned, an armed rising against the Roman Government. But my servants are going to conquer the Roman Empire; they must, inevitably, because it is founded upon a religion, and that religion is a lie. Those who are of the truth will extend, because they must extend, their influence; and as the truth establishes itself in men's hearts your lie will crumble, and your pagan empire will crumble with it. The Roman discipline has conquered the world by force of arms; the Christian discipline is to conquer the world by the compelling power of its own reasonableness, and the infectious influence which its divine origin guarantees."

Dear Parishioners of Ste Rose, Laurier and McCreary

This Sunday, Christ the King, is the last in this year's liturgical cycle—and we aren't all that far from the end of calendar year either. As we approach the end of the year, let me remind you of our 2019 responsibilities to the Archdiocese, Sharing God's Gifts (the Archbishop's Charity Appeal) and the Archdiocesan Assessment (the parish tax towards Archdiocesan administration expenses):

Ste Rose: \$8470 (SGG) + \$13680 (Assessment) = \$22,150

Laurier: \$2250 (SGG) + \$3640 (Assessment) = \$5,890

McCreary: \$1960 (SGG) + \$3170 (Assessment) = \$5,130

As in past years, the Archdiocese returns to our parishes all contributions to Sharing God's Gifts that exceed our assigned targets. (For example, if Ste Rose contributed \$25,000 to Sharing God's Gifts, the Archdiocese would return \$25,000 - \$8,470 = \$16,530) Moreover, all contributions to SGG are exempt from the 16% tax on our Sunday collections (which is what the Assessment amounts express)—therefore it would be prudent for us to contribute very generously to Sharing God's Gifts.
